

Jam: Tim, did you read the newspaper today? It said that the United Nations is almost **in the red.** How can that be?

Tim: Well, one of the problems is that the US owes about \$2 billion because it hasn't paid its regular membership dues since the early 1970's. Jam: Yeah, you're right. Japan is not able to send the Self-Defense Force to fight. I hope this wouldn't cause them to **back out.** What other things does the US support?

Tim: Things like the World Bank or the Red Cross. But in many ways, congress keeps a tight hold on the national purse strings.
