*Yes, I think life is a race against time. / No, I don't think life is a race against time.

*I'd rather have more...than...because...



Vocabulary

1 Eternal (/ɪˈtɜːrnl/)

(adjective) Without an end, existing or continuing forever

Ex. There's a promise of eternal life in heaven.

2 Long-lasting

(adjective) That can or does last for a long time

Ex. I think our relationship is <u>long-lasting</u>.

3 Brief (/briːf/)

(adjective) Lasting only a short time

Ex. We took a <u>brief</u> silence.

4 Wear on (/wer/)

(verb) (of time) to pass, especially in a way that seems slow.

Ex. As the evening wore on, she became more and more nervous.

5 Elapse (/ɪˈlæps/)

(verb) If a period of time elapses, it passes

Ex. Many years elapsed before they met again.

Idioms / Useful Expressions

1 Time (alone) will tell, only time will tell – used to say that you will have to wait for some time to find out the result of a situation

Ex. Only time will tell if the treatment has been successful.

2 Time capsule – a container that is filled with objects that people think are typical of the time they are living in. It is buried so that it can be discovered by people in the future

Ex. I want to have a time capsule.



3 Time flies – time seems to past very quickly.

Ex. <u>Time has flown</u> since the holiday began.

4 In the nick of time - at the very last moment, just in time before something bad happens

Ex. They escaped from the smoke-filled house just in the nick of time.

5 As time goes by – as time passes or moves

Ex. As time goes by I have become less interested in going to nightclubs.

6 Kill time – to do something that is not very interesting or important to pass time

Ex. We've got 4 hours until our flight leaves. How are we going to <u>kill the</u> time?

7 Have a whale of time – to enjoy yourself very much, to have a great time

Ex. The kids <u>had a whale of time</u> at the theme park.

8 Be a good/bad timekeeper – be regularly on time/late for work

Ex. You're such a good timekeeper.

9 It's about time - (it is) past the time when something should have happened

Ex. <u>It's about time</u> to tie the knot.
