Situation: You have just had a broken arm put in a cast. The doctor is giving you instructions for follow-up care.

Question: What should you do to prevent swelling?

- 1 Have your cast changed regularly.
- 2 Get some more medication after six weeks.
- 3 Begin physical therapy immediately.
- 4 Keep your arm raised whenever possible.

Situation: Your flight has just arrived at the airport. You want to get downtown as quickly as possible. The attendant at the information desk is explaining your options.

Question: Where should you go?

- 1 To the taxi stand.
- 2 To Aisle 4.
- 3 To the lower level.
- 4 To Aisle 3.

No. 27

Situation: You are a student and want to join a study-abroad program. You cannot go before the last day of August. The coordinator makes the following announcement.

Question: Which school will you choose?

- 4 Vancouver Island University.

Situation: You return to your office after lunch and hear the following voicemail message. You will not finish the report until late tonight.

Question: What should you do?

- 4 Give Tracy the report tomorrow morning.

Situation: You are attending a wedding reception. You brought a coffeemaker as a gift. The bride's brother makes the following announcement.

Question: What should you do with your gift?

- 1 Leave it next to the entrance.
- 2 Take it to the back of the room.
- 3 Give it to the groom's sister.
- 4 Put it beside the bandstand.

(G) You have 10 second to read the situation and Question No. 25.

Minor pain is normal, especially at first. If it becomes severe and the medication isn't helping, get in touch with us right away. We may need to adjust your prescription. When you bathe, cover the cast with two layers of plastic to keep it dry. Plastic bags work well for this. Also, to stop the arm from swelling, try to keep it above heart level as much as you can. It'll take six to eight weeks for the bone to heal completely. After that time, we'll remove the cast and start your physical therapy.

(H) You have 10 second to read the situation and Question No. 26.

If you aren't concerned about cost, taxis leave from the stand outside. Alternatively, the bus goes to all central areas of the city. See the attendant in Aisle 4 for information. If you're staying at one of the major hotels, free shuttles depart from Aisle 3. Since its rush hour, though, going by road will take longer than usual. Even by taxi, it'll take at least an hour. You could take the train, which leaves every 10 minutes from the underground station on the lower level. This will get you downtown in 20 minutes.

(I) You have 10 second to read the situation and Question No. 27.

Please remember the deadline for choosing a program is June 21st. All the programs are 15 weeks long. In Australia, Queensland University starts August 15th, and Sunshine Coast University starts August 23rd. This is just before the beginning of spring in Australia, and both schools are fairly close to beaches. In the U.S., Idaho State University has two fall programs, starting August 15th and September 10th. The weather is generally cool and dry during

this season. Vancouver Island University in Canada has an August 1st start date. It can be quite rainy there during that time.

(J) You have 10 second to read the situation and Question No. 28. This is Tracy from human resources. We're still waiting for your department's cost analysis report. We need to have it tomorrow morning at the very latest. Otherwise we can't guarantee it'll be considered in tomorrow afternoon's budget meeting, which could affect your funding for the coming year. I have to leave by 6 this evening. If you can't get it done by then, bring it to me on the third floor first thing tomorrow morning. If you think you won't be able to submit it before the meeting, please call me tomorrow. Thanks.

(K) You have 10 second to read the situation and Question No. 28. Thank you for coming to celebrate Brenda and Anthony's marriage. Be sure to sign the register—it's just inside the entrance. Any cards should b left with the groom's sister, who's sitting at the table next to the cake. Leave any other items on the table at the back of the room. If you need a drink at any time, please take advantage of the open bar beside the bandstand. I'll be making a toast to the bride and groom in about five minutes, so have your champagne ready.
