The reading states that (tell something about the

in the READING (takes too much time)

The man's opinion is that.... (Man's idea... good idea? Bad idea?)

(43 seconds) He provides 2 reasons.	
(22 seconds) First,	
(3 seconds) Second,	
(0 second) That's why	

NOTE:

- 1. Don't worry about paraphrasing or changing what you heard.
- 2. Say the exact same way with the exact same words.
- 3. You are not expected to change anything dramatically.
- 4. Use the keywords that you heard.
- 5. The timer is your friend. Practice with a timer and use it to control your speech.
- 6. The timer counts down from 60 seconds not up.

This is powerful of way of showing the person grading you that you heard everything, you understood the structure, and deserve the highest score possible.
