Don't burn through questions. Students feel like they always have to practice new questions. But it DOESN'T WORK. What you have to do is MASTER A **QUESTION**. Practice the same question so many times until you almost have it memorized. But don't just memorize it. Think about it. Remember the structure. It will become easier. Just like anything else, doing the same exact thing over time, will help you when there's a little bit of variation.
