
## Phrasal Verb 101: Lesson 14 G

Common phrasal verbs, with meanings and examples. Phrasal verbs are usually two-word phrases consisting of **verb + adverb** or **verb + preposition**. Think of them as you would any other English vocabulary. Study them as you come across them, rather than trying to memorize many at once.



Verb	Meaning	Example
get back	return	We <b>got back</b> from our vacation last week.
get something back	receive something you had before	Liz finally <b>got</b> her Science notes <b>back</b> from my room-mate.
get back at someone	retaliate, take revenge	My sister <b>got back at</b> me for stealing her shoes. She stole my favourite hat.

"He's the one I was telling you about, Uncle Clydel"

<b>get back into</b> something	become interested in something again	I finally <b>got back into</b> my novel and finished it.
<b>get on</b> something	step onto a vehicle	We're going to freeze out here if you don't let us <b>get on</b> the bus.
