

# Phrasal Verb 101: Lesson 18 H

Common phrasal verbs, with meanings and examples.  
Phrasal verbs are usually two-word phrases consisting of **verb + adverb** or **verb + preposition**.

Think of them as you would any other English vocabulary.  
Study them as you come across them, rather than trying to memorize many at once.

Verb	Meaning	Example
<b>hand</b> <i>something</i> <b>down</b>	give something used to someone else	I <b>handed</b> my old comic books <b>down</b> to my little cousin.
<b>hand</b> <i>something</i> <b>in</b>	submit	I have to <b>hand in</b> my essay by Friday.
<b>hand</b> <i>something</i> <b>out</b>	to distribute to a group of people	We will <b>hand out</b> the invitations at the door.
<b>hand</b> <i>something</i> <b>over</b>	give (usually unwillingly)	The police asked the man to <b>hand over</b> his wallet and his weapons.
<b>hang in</b>	stay positive (N.Amer., informal)	<b>Hang in</b> there. I'm sure you'll find a job very soon.
