## Phrasal Verb 101 : Lesson 27 R

Common phrasal verbs, with meanings and examples. Phrasal verbs are usually two-word phrases consisting of **verb + adverb** or **verb + preposition**. Think of them as you would any other English vocabulary. Study them as you come across them, rather than trying to memorize many at once.



"Just ignore him—he's threatened to run away before."

Verb	Meaning		Example
<b>run into</b> someone/ something	meet unexpectedly	I ran into	an old school-friend at the mall.

<b>run over</b> someone/ something	drive a vehicle over a person or thing	I accidentally <b>ran over</b> your bicycle in the driveway.
run over/ through something	rehearse, review	Let's <b>run over/through</b> these lines one more time before the show.
run away	leave unexpectedly, escape	The child <b>ran away</b> from home and has been missing for three days.
run out	have none left	We <b>ran out</b> of shampoo so I had to wash my hair with soap.
