G. Separable phrasal verbs: *cheer up, hold up, get back, try on, try out*

When a phrasal verb is separable, separation is optional (not necessary) when the direct object is a noun.

CORRECT: *Zookeepers tried to cheer up Pankov.*

CORRECT: *Zookeepers tried to cheer Pankov up.*

Separation is obligatory (necessary) when the direct object is a pronoun.

CORRECT: *Zookeepers tried to cheer her up.*

INCORRECT: *Zookeepers tried to cheer up her.*
