
Man Dances at His Own Funeral


1. Quick Reading

be dumbfounded · · · · · · · · · · be unable to speak because of shock or surprise

go crazy · · · · · become very excited and act wildly

rip someone or something off* steal from someone; steal something

get over something* · · · · · · · · recover from a physical illness or an emotional shock

turn into something* · · · · · · · become something different


be on top of the world · · · · · · · · · feel very happy




2. Listen

Cover the story and look only at these pictures. Listen to the story two or three times.


















3. Read the Story
