Did you know that more people speak Mandarin Chinese than any other language? 15% of the world's population speaks Mandarin, but English is the world's international language. Maybe that's because people speak English as their native language on many different continents.

People speak English differently in different parts of the world. The words aren't always the same. For example, if you ask for a biscuit in America, you'll get a kind of bread. In England, Ireland, or Australia, you'll get a

cookie. People in America and Canada say they live in apartments but people in England call them flats. In England, 'color' is spelled 'colour' and 'favorite' is spelled 'favourite'.

The pronunciation of words and the grammar are also sometimes different. It's important to listen to the accents of native speakers from around the world so you can understand all of them.

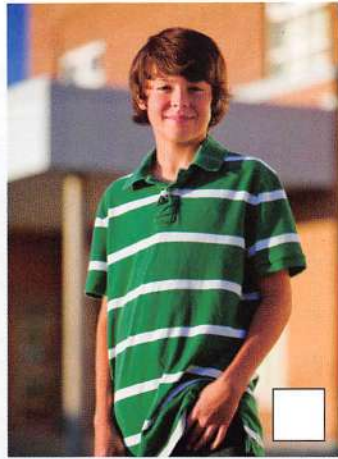
