

The Dream Catcher Do you ever have bad dreams at night? Native Americans believe that a dream catcher can catch your unhappy dreams. Then you will only have happy dreams. Have you ever seen a dream catcher? It looks like a spider's web. You can make a dream catcher. Here is how to do it. feathers a paper plate varn Finally, tie feathers to the yarn. Now weave across the plate. A few pieces of yarn can hang down. Put beads on the varn. Cut out the center of a paper plate. Around the plate, make holes about I cm apart. Hang your dream catcher on the wall. Put yarn into one hole. Then weave the yarn from hole to hole, up and over, around the plate. Sweet dreams!
